# PRIVACY STATEMENT EQUAL JUSTICE EQUAL PAY FOUNDATION

# 1. Controller and contact

This is the privacy statement of the Equal Justice Equal Pay Foundation (hereafter: "**the Foundation**" or "**we**") (Chamber of Commerce registration: 86307835), established in Amsterdam, visiting address (4125 RD), Hoef en Haag at the Notaris appelpad 9. The Foundation values privacy and is committed to the protection of the personal data of members of the Support Group.

The Foundation represents the interests of seafarers or former seafarers (the "Support Group") who suffer, have suffered and/or run risk of suffering damages caused by ship owners or their related entities, including manning agencies (collectively, the "Ship owners"). The Foundation may initiate legal proceedings and/or settlement negotiations on behalf of the Support Group against Ship owners and/or will try to conclude settlements with Ship owners.

The foundation, among others, represents (former) citizens of the Republic of the Philippines or the Republic of Indonesia who were employed directly or indirectly on a ship or ships registered in the Kingdom of the Netherlands at rates of pay and/or under conditions which were discriminatory.

This privacy statement describes how the Foundation processes your personal data and which rights you have. The Foundation is the controller with regard to the processing of your personal data described in this privacy statement. All personal data is collected, processed and secured in accordance with the General Data Protection Regulation ("GDPR").

# 2. From whom do we process personal data?

The Foundation processes the personal data from:

- Members of the Support Group who have entered into an Agreement and Deed of Assignment, Exclusive Mandate and Power of Attorney with the Foundation;
- Members of the Support Group who have registered their potential claim at www.seafarersclaim.com;
- Potential Support Group Members;
- Persons who wish to be kept informed;
- Visitors of the website www.seafarersclaim.com.

# 3. Categories of personal data

#### 3.1 Support Group members

The Foundation processes, *inter alia*, the following personal data of members of the Support Group:

- First name and surname, preposition, title;
- Address, place and country of residence;
- Nationality;
- Email address;
- Telephone number;
- Date of birth;
- Sex:
- Correspondence with you;
- Copy of valid ID (national identification number shall be masked);
- Financial data, such as your bank account number/IBAN number;
- Data with regard to your financial situation, a.o. your work income and or benefits received;
- Data with regard to your working situation, which may include (parts of) your employment (contract) history, correspondence with your (former) employer, ship employment manuals/guidelines and salary;
- Ships worked on and routes travelled;
- Any other personal data and evidence that you provide to us or which is required or necessary for purposes described below.

#### 3.2 Website visitors

When you visit our website, www.seafarersclaim.com, we need certain information in order for the Website to function properly and for security purposes. This includes information about the device you use to visit the website and data about the navigation and your behavior on the website. We also store information collected by means of cookies (See Cookie Policy).

### 3.3 Potential Support Group members

We promote our cause to potential Support Group members through social media. To this end we process:

- Demographic information and other characteristics about the persons who may be interested in our cause. We can only target groups of persons with certain characteristics. We do not know which people see our advertisements;
- If you click on an advertisement:
  - The ad that you have clicked on;
  - Whether you continue on our website to register;
  - Technical information as described under 3.2.

# 4. For what purpose and on what legal basis do we process personal data?

The Foundation processes your data for the following purposes:

#### 5. Retention terms

The Foundation does not retain personal data for longer than is necessary for the purposes for which your data is collected. If possible, personal data will be pseudonymized.

Inter alia the following retention terms apply:

Personal data in active files	Until the legal procedure and the archiving period (please see below) have ended	
Personal data in archived files	20 years from the date the file has been archived. If a procedure becomes active again, the retention term will start over.	
Personal data in the financial administration	7 years from the fiscal year	
Cookie information	A maximum of 6 months (please see our cookie statement for the expiration time)	

# 6. (Categories of) recipients

The Foundation may use third party services to process your personal data in line with this Privacy Policy. Some of these parties act as processors for the Foundation and the Foundation ensures that these parties provide sufficient safeguards in terms of technical and organizational security measures. With third parties that act as processors for Foundation, we have entered into a processor agreement that provides that they will only process data in accordance with the Foundations' instructions.

The Foundation will only share your personal data with third parties to the extent necessary for the purposes mentioned in this privacy statement. For example, the Foundation may share participants' personal data with its lawyers, counterparties, process financiers, experts, courts, bailiffs and similar parties.

The Foundation promotes its cause on:

• Instagram and Facebook, both owned by Meta Ireland ("**Meta**"). For this purpose, the Foundation and Meta are joint controller and we have closed an agreement to determine our respective responsibilities. In cases other than those referred to above, the Foundation will only share your personal data with third parties if you have given your consent to do so, in order to comply with (legal) obligations or if this is necessary for the legitimate interests pursued by the Foundation or third parties. If possible, personal data will be pseudonymized.

#### 7. Transfers of third countries

Your personal data will only be stored or processed outside the EU/EEA by us or by third parties if this is in accordance with the applicable regulations for the transfer of personal data to countries outside the EU/EEA. This means that we will only transfer your personal data to countries outside the EU/EEA if the European Commission has decided that the third country in question guarantees an adequate level of protection, or if other appropriate safeguards are provided, such as an adequacy decision or the use of unmodified standard contractual clauses that have been approved by the European Commission. #### 8. Cookies

Cookies are small text files that are stored on your computer, smartphone or other device when you visit our website www.seafarersclaim.com. Cookies help us to function, analyze and personalize the website. Cookies remember data from your previous visit to the website so that the site works better and displays more relevant information for you. We also use comparable techniques, such as web beacons and pixels.

Cookies do not allow us to access your computer, smartphone or other device, nor do they allow us to access any information other than that for which you have given us permission. We give you the choice to accept or reject cookies, with the exception of functional cookies and cookies with no or limited impact on your privacy. In addition, you can also adjust your web browser settings to refuse cookies. As a result, it is possible that our website is no longer fully functional.

The Foundation makes use of the following first party cookies, which are placed by the foundation itself:

## 9. Your rights

The GDPR provides you with the right of access, rectification and erasure of your personal data. In addition, you can ask us for restriction of the processing, to transfer the personal data and you have the right to object to the processing.
